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TOP PRODUCTS FOR AN ORGANISED SEWING/CRAFT ROOM

Sewing and craft rooms can be tricky to organise as there are so many bits and pieces! A few essential storage pieces will get your room perfectly organised so it becomes a usable and effective space to spend time creating and crafting in.

- **DESK**

A good desk is an obvious essential to any craft or sewing room - somewhere to sit and create! Look for one with leg room, and drawers on one side (or both sides) to store your go-to, or bulkier, items.



- **DESK LAMP**

Good lighting is not only important for the health of your eyes, but can also help you out with particular projects that have finer details.

When you need to see something up close, a lamp that can be directed like a spotlight onto your work will help you see exactly what you're doing.



- **STORAGE BOXES**

Storage boxes are *essential* in a sewing room for corralling different bits and pieces. You could use them to hold wool supplies (sorted into colours), work in progress, batting, scrap fabric pieces, templates, embroidery cones.



Whatever needs to be categorised in your room, storage boxes will do the job! You can mix up the type of basket you use - woven, clear, fabric - to bring a range of textures into your space.

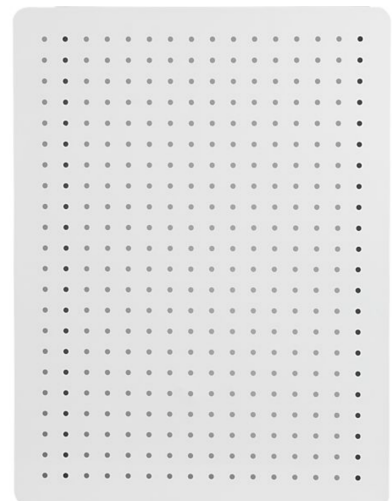
- **MAGAZINE HOLDERS**

These files are perfect for holding items that need to be upright and stacked, such as patterns, different types of paper for crafting, stencils, or even stacks of fabric.



- **PEG BOARD**

Peg-board is incredibly handy in a sewing room because it can be hung above your desk to hold your go-to items within easy reach. Attaching hooks to hold scissors and containers, or dowel to hold thread, keeps everything accessible. You can also customise the board by giving it a quick spray paint to match your room decor.



- **JARS**

Jars are perfect for holding the smaller items, and because they are clear you can see exactly what you have/need. Things like buttons, beads, ribbon (colour categorised), pencils, thread, bobbins, tape. Put things in here that you are happy to have on display, that are colourful and look pretty.



- **SMALL BOWLS / CONTAINERS / POTS**

These can do the same job as jars, but because they are not clear, you can put the 'less attractive' items in here that you don't necessarily want to display.



- **OPEN SHELVING**

Open shelving is the perfect place to display your jars and bowls! Being a craft room, things should look colourful and bright, so show off your most-loved items.



- **HOOKS**

Hooks screwed directly into the underside of the open shelves (some shelves come with these already attached) allow you to hang go-to tools, such as scissors, measuring tape, cutting tools etc.



- **KALLAX UNIT (OR SIMILAR)**

The Kallax unit (from Ikea) is perfect for a sewing or craft room, because it prevents an overflowing mess of items by dividing it into storage sections.

Storage boxes and magazine files fit perfectly into each cube. If you have a big fabric collection it could be separated and displayed in each section.



- **LABELS**

Finish off your organising project the right way by labelling everything so you can quickly and easily find what you need. Labels that tie onto storage baskets work best, and a hand-held labeller will do the trick for naming the contents inside magazine files.



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
